

Today I want to talk just a little bit about being an average Christian. I read an article from Charles Spurgeon recently and it seems relevant today. This sums up my thoughts after reading the article as I reflect on society today. I quote this: *Too many persons judge themselves by others; and if upon the whole they discover that they are no worse than the mass of mankind, they give themselves a mark of special commendation; they strike a sort of average amongst their neighbors, and if they cannot pretend to be the very best, yet, if they are not the very worst, they are pretty comfortable. I struggle as well with comparing myself to others; other ministers, fathers, and friends. We can take comparing ourselves even further than comparing ourselves to others. We desire to be better at all the things we do, we strive and it is good to strive to be the best at what you do. Be the best worker, ballplayer, student, son, daughter, mother, and father. We compare ourselves to the best and most of the time feel average or less than average compared to the best.*

My recommendation is the same as Reverend Spurgeon's, do not be OK with being average at everything. Find your talent, the gift God gave to you and be the best Christian person you can be by using your special talent. Make a difference in someone's life each day.

Be unashamed of your Christianity each day by displaying your gift and doing what you are called to do. If you are participating in a sport strive to be the best. Most importantly take time to witness for Christ giving thanks to God for the opportunity to play; before, during, and after the game. I ask that you share your faith with all who gather to play and watch the event as well.

As a Christian you know the evilness of sin, repent from it and embrace Christ Jesus. You have been pardoned from your sins and you have welcomed the Holy Spirit into your life. Be confident of your future; a future with God in eternity. Share that message with one new person this month.

This past Sunday we shared an evening with two groups of singers that shared their love of God with us. By using the gift of music given to each of them. I ask that you also strive for perfection, live life with gusto, do not be average, embrace the person that God has made you to be and be the best Christian you can be each moment of each day. as Christ-followers, must guard against: the cooling of our hearts. "Never restrain or put out the fire of the Holy Spirit." (I Thessalonians 5:19 TPT) How can Christians restrain Holy Spirit's fire? Well, what does any fire require in order to burn? Fuel and air. Fuel is easy enough; people gather fallen branches, pile some leaves, gather some trash – dead things. What fuel does Holy Spirit want? "Then how much more powerful is the blood of the Anointed One, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself as a spotless sacrifice to God, purifying your conscience from the dead things of the world to the service of the living God?" (Hebrews 9:14 The Voice). Holy Spirit wants to burn away everything dead in your life – everything that is not His will for you, everything holding back His best from you, everything hindering His work through you. That's the fuel for His fire. What's the air? "They all gave themselves single-heartedly to prayer, with the women, including Mary, Jesus' mother, and his brothers." (Acts 1:14 NTE) Earnest, disciplined, unified, Spirit-led prayer: that's what Christ's closest followers devoted themselves to doing in the days leading up to Pentecost, an occasion we still celebrate for the divine fire that crowned it. Their prayers were the air for that fire. Do you think modern Christians could benefit by following the disciples' example? How about you? If you've asked Jesus to be your Savior, He's sent His fire into your heart. But how much air have you been giving Holy Spirit lately? How much fuel? These are the choices that determine how hot the fire in your heart will burn. Please, don't let it fade; don't restrain His flames.

This meeting is open to anyone who would like to learn more about what our church is planning for the kids in our church and community.



From your Lay Leader ...

I Have Prepared for You a Place September 2021

John 14:1-3 "Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust also in me. There is more than enough room in my Father's home. If this were not so, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so

that you will always be with me where I am.

When Jesus came to earth to live as a man, He chose to have the profession of His fleshly father. He was a carpenter. Carpenters build things. Although Jesus was a carpenter, he had no home for himself. Yes, Jesus was homeless. We should think about that more often and let that fact inform our view of the homeless. (But I digress). Most of the time when we think about John 14, we think about heaven and just how wonderful it is. We try to imagine the place that Jesus has prepared for us. We think of streets of gold and how awesome this paradise will be. We have totally missed the point...

What would your house look like if there were no designer? What would your house look like if there were no builder? Obviously, there would be no house at all. I think you get the point. If you ever find yourself in a conversation with a friend that is having trouble believing that there is a God, take them down that path. However, we are still missing the greater point of John 14.

Where is this home? Jesus said "trust in God and also trust in me." He also said "When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will be with me always." We sometimes explain getting saved to children like me as allowing God to come into your heart. If you are going to do that, there must be room for Him to be there. In order for there to be room in our hearts for God, we must allow Him to create that room. Jesus wants us to allow Him to prepare ourselves for Him to be in us. In other words, we must allow ourselves to be built into His likeness.

Building a house takes a few months but then it must be maintained forever. Giving your life to Jesus Christ takes an instant but allowing Him to mold us build us into His perfect image takes a lifetime. What can you do differently this month to allow yourself to be molded by God? What can be more important than that? We only have so much time in this life. Feeding our Faith with His word through reading, hearing and seeing is the most important thing on our schedule. Everything else is secondary. Let your place be prepared.
