PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVES May 2019



April Showers bring May flowers, at least that is how the saying goes. What is the real meaning/ Message? Do you think it is saying that if you are willing to endure the rain and the cloudy gloomy days of April, we will come to know the full beauty of nature in May?

Our Christian lives reflect nature at times. There are those long, cold, dark periods, when God and His love seem so very far away. There are also those periods when we do not understand and Jesus Christ looked to his Father in heaven for strength for what he must endure. Should we do any less? This was the dark gloomy period for Jesus, a period he may have liked to avoid. As he prayed at the Mt. of Olives, right after his arrest, he said to his Father in heaven, "If thou be willing, remove this cup from me, not my will, but thine be done." Jesus knew that he was sent for a reason. John 17:4 tells us that it was his task to glorify his Father in heaven. Each of us when we take Jesus into our lives and more exactly into our hearts- have that same task- and that is to glorify the Father.

This is often not an easy task for any of us. It began with Christ our prime example. It is meant to be carried on with and through every spiritual leader. I pray I have modeled Christ in some way at some time for you. Christ "in you" is meant to continue on in you as you share the love and the example of His life as it has touched upon your life. I have never known anyone personally who has ever had to endure personally what Jesus was called upon to endure. So to me it seems less of a task to say, "Not my will, but thy will be done." Crucifixion is not before any of us.

Twenty-seven years ago I sat with my first District Superintendent and described what I thought would be one of my greatest shortcomings or areas of concerns. It was that of taking on the emotions of those I am with. Some of you have seen the full me: if you have ever had a loved one slowly slip away or to be snatched away, if I have baptized your small child, or officiated at your wedding. It was not long into ministry that I soon learned, that which I thought was a shortcoming was one of my greatest strengths. Over 25 years ago I reversed my thinking about how I look at the trait of connecting with ones emotions. I learned that people of God would rather know that their pastor cares and shares and sheds tears and laughter than to be stone cold to the life happenings of those in his or her congregation. We question God. The Scriptures tell us that if we will wait upon the Lord, we will be lifted up.

I will always remember the Sunday that Carolyn Caldwell shared of my upcoming move. There was some of what I expected, but yet more that of pain in the eyes of those in attendance, those who could not speak until later on. At times love hurts. This morning I was asked how many years I served at previous church charges? And then, why not as long here? I have no answer. When I finally said, "YES" to God roughly 29 years ago, I did so stepping out in faith, without a lot of answers. I did not even ask the questions. It was with, and still is with, a faith that my/our God will provide. I told my first D.S. that I would live in a shack if God asked me to and many times over He has provided for my family and me well beyond a shack. I/we understand that it's hard letting a pastor go-because for us -in reverse- it is equally hard in our letting go of you. BUT, if I am to be obedient to the Father I must answer the call to go. More than taking vows to be itinerant to a denomination, I made a solemn vow to be God's first and foremost servant. God choose me for this vocation called ministry, I did not choose it. I was not equipped, but He equipped me. I am His and He is mine. Please know that Karen and I have felt blessed by our time at Damascus. We hope and pray you have been blessed by our time here as well.
